OCTOBER IS DYSLEXIA AWARENESS MONTH!

Having a child diagnosed with dyslexia can be a traumatic experience. While dyslexia can make reading more difficult, with the right instruction, almost all individuals with dyslexia can learn to read. Many people with dyslexia have gone on to accomplish great things. Among the many dyslexia success stories are Thomas Edison, Stephen Spielberg, Hans Christian Anderson, Jim Carrey, Whoopi Goldberg, and Albert Einstein.

Dyslexia is a neurological condition caused by a different wiring of the brain. There is no cure for dyslexia and individuals with this condition must learn coping strategies. Research indicates that dyslexia has no relationship to intelligence. **Individuals with dyslexia are neither more nor less intelligent than the general population. But some say the way individuals with dyslexia think can actually be an asset in achieving success**.

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You may be dyslexic if you...

• Read slowly and with much effort

...But are often the one to solve the problem

Can't spell; have messy handwriting

...But your writing shows terrific imagination

Have trouble remembering dates and names

...But you grasp the big picture and demonstrate out-of-the-box thinking

• Have difficulty retrieving and pronouncing spoken words

...But have excellent vocabulary and ideas

East Flat Band News October 2019 *



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What is the East Flat Band Program?

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The East Flat Band program consists of bands from W. J. Berezowsky Public School and Princess Margaret School. There are 3 bands at each school: Grade 5 students are Beginner Band, Grade 6 students are Intermediate Band, and Grade 7/8 students are Senior Band. These groups are led by myself, Ms. Amy Timm. Together we form larger bands for trips, festival, and concerts. Here's an idea of the events you can expect for the 2018-2019 school year:

- SRPSD Beginner Band Clinic (September)
- East Flat Band Winter Concert (December)
- Prince Albert Kiwanis Music Festival (March)
- SPRSD Massed Band Concert (May)
- Year-End Band Trips (May-June)
- Fundraisers (throughout the year)

If you have a child entering Grade 5 or Grade 6—congratulations! All Grade 5 and 6 students get the opportunity to take band, and it is my hope that they will become hooked on making music. Playing a musical instrument increases reading and comprehension skills, develops discipline, increases fine motor skills, encourages personal expression, develops patience, and builds confidence. Being a part of an ensemble encourages teamwork, promotes social skills and accountability, and provides a sense of belonging.

Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division is a firm believer in music education, therefore all students of the East Flat Band program are able to be a part of band free of charge, with no fee for borrowing an instrument, consumable supplies, or repairs! *This is an incredible and unique opportunity for your child.* They will spend 2 years discovering and developing their musical abilities through a host of events and opportunities. Once students enter Grade 7 and 8, parents/guardians and their children can take time to decide whether they wish to continue band or pursue other opportunities.

SRPSD Beginner Band Clinic

Beginner Band Clinic was a great success with over **300 beginner band students** attending from across Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division over the two days of clinics. Students arrived with an instrument and excitement and left with even more excitement, a better understanding, and a few notes under their belts. A big thank-you to all the clinicians that shared their time and expertise to give our beginners the best start possible!

Practice Club

Practice Club is open to all band students grade 5-8, and will take place in the music room on **Wednesdays from 3:30-4:30 pm.** This is a great opportunity for your child to bring questions or struggles, share their successes, or get extra help with their instrument. Permission notes will be going home this month.

Fundraising and School Band Trips

Each band student in grades 5-8 will have the opportunity to participate in a **year-end band trip**. There will be fundraisers held throughout the year to cover costs of the trip, as **each child needs to earn their own way** through these initiatives. Stay tuned for upcoming fundraising initiatives.

Music Stand Order

I will be making an order for wire music stands this year. These are a great tool for home practice as it encourages good playing posture and focus. Students wishing to purchase a stand need to bring **\$13 along with their order form** by the end of the October. The order will be placed soon afterwards.

Instruments and the Cold

As the weather begins to cool down, it is important to make sure our band instruments are kept in good shape. Corks, pads, etc. on the instruments can shrink and warp with cold/hot environment changes leaving instruments leaky and frustrating to play. Please ensure that your child's instrument is kept in room temperature and NEVER leave an instrument in a vehicle or outside overnight. Following this simple rule will avoid costly repair bills which hurt our band programs. Please help keep our instruments in good shape for years down the road!
