Children very quickly pick up the idea that school is not isolated from their home and that we are partners in their education.

A child's attendance at school can break the students' ability to succeed in his/her grade. I cannot stress enough the importance of coming to school every day. When a child misses a lot of school, gaps occur in their learning. The worst part is that the student is always in the position of "catching up". When students are in Kindergarten or grades 1, 2, and 3, the gaps are even greater, as so much learning is oral, demonstration, and activity based. i.e.alphabet sounds, spelling, math skills, language. In the higher grades oral instructions, labs, and math activities are missed, therefore, homework piles up very quickly. Please ensure that your kids come to school every day. As a community we want our kids to succeed! As parents and educators we must support each other and give our children a very clear message - "You must go to school every day." It would be wonderful to see our overall attendance percentage at 100%.
