Bridges is an employment and training initiative, assisting individuals who have recently transitioned out of the Provincial Correctional System back into the community. Students receive certificates and workplace skills from multiple training opportunities, classroom work, guest speakers and volunteer work experiences, all with the intent of bridging into meaningfur employment upon completion.

This 10-week program is PTA (Provincial Training Allowance) eligible. All participants must be
referred from either a Probation Officer, or an Addictions/Mental Health counselor, and must
have been released from the corrections systems in the last year (ex. All participants in 2019
must have been released in 2018 or 2019). Intakes and interviews are conducted prior to
