GRADE 4P

Where have the first two months of school gone already?? Time has flown by and we are busy, busy, busy! All the students are eagerly counting down the days until Halloween. This ghoulish holiday is a fanfavorite in our classroom and the students can't wait until the "big" party. Another exciting event we will soon be preparing for in our classroom is the Remembrance Day Service. We are looking forward to being a part of the service by reading the poem, *In Flanders Fields*. All friends and family members are invited to attend what we hope will be a meaningful service dedicated to the memory of the many Canadians who sacrificed their life for our freedom. We will also be taking time to think of the Canadians today who strive to encourage peace in troubled regions of the world.

The grade 4P class LOVE MATH!! They are lucky enough to have Mrs. Court as their Math teacher and their Math classes are full of learning. The students started the year off by examining a 'Number of the Day'. It was during this time they represented the chosen number using expanded form, base ten blocks, and using words. They also determined if the number was odd or even and what it would read if it was 10 less or 10 more. They have graduated to spending a portion of their Math class on multiplication and sharpening their basic multiplication facts. Another portion of class has the students learning and implementing various strategies for adding and subtracting numbers with and without regrouping. Life is never dull in Math class.

Science class is another favorite for the students. They once again find themselves lucky enough to experience the expertise of another teacher, as Ms. Cournoyer is their teacher for this subject. They began the year studying a unit focused on, Sound. During this unit the students studied vocabulary words, such as: natural sounds, artificial sounds, vibrate, sound waves, pitch, and echo. Their culminating project for this unit was to create an instrument that made sound. Each student had the opportunity to present their instrument to their classmates and explain how they made sound. This project was very exciting to the students because it was a very hands-on, and their first opportunity of the year to present to their classmates.

This year the students have two Health teachers. Ms. Strom and myself each have the students for one Health class a week. Ms. Strom has begun the school year by discussing personal safety and protection in various environments/situations. The students have had many interesting discussions related the safety precautions that should be taken when near water, around fire, and riding a bike.

They have also discussed the laws and rules we have in our community that are in place to minimize and prevent risks when going about daily activities. For example, they have discussed the importance of smoke detectors, life jackets, and smoking only in designated areas.

During the Health class in which the students are with me, we are discussing the characteristics of healthy and unhealthy relationships, as well as the importance of setting boundaries in relationships to feel comfortable. In the near future, we will be discussing what disagreements look like, sound like, and feel like, as well as, the idea disagreements are a part of healthy and unhealthy relationships.

Another class the students also experience two teachers is Art class. Mrs. Acorn is in charge of the Music, Dance, and Drama portion, while I am instructing the students in the Visual Arts' classes. We have already created many beautiful masterpieces that adorn the school walls. In the spirit of autumn, we have created sunflowers using newspaper and black shoe polish. Colourful autumn trees made of tissue paper and oil pastel also hang in the hallway. Colourful turkeys were also created using a transfer technique of oil pastels. Another labour of love were the lions we created using cardboard, paint, and a painter's canvas. They are absolutely stunning and have received many compliments. Our latest project has the students learning the technique of weaving. Our poppies will soon be completed as a symbol of the blood shed on the battlefields and the peace we strive for today.

Thank you to all the families for the conversations you have every night with your children about their day at school, and insisting they tell you, "One thing they did or learned at school." The importance of daily conversations is often not acknowledged in our busy day, but please remember, "To the world you may be one person, but to the little people in your life, you may be the world."

Our school Remembrance Day service will be held on Thursday, November 10 at 10:45 in the gymnasium. There is no school for the students on Friday, November 11 and Monday, November 14.
