GRADE 4

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Welcome to the second month of the school year for us at W.J. Berezowsky Public School. October promises to be a month full of walk-a-thons, Picture Days, being thankful, and ghoulish creatures wandering the halls.

An integral part of our English Language Arts program this year is our daily word study. A daily word study program is a key component of the Literacy Model in which our school division has developed. The word study program our classroom follows is a five-day program. Our words are chosen each week based on the spelling rule/sound we are studying. So far this year we have studies the FLSZ rule, when to double a consonant at the end of a word, and when to use the letters <ck> at the end of a word or syllable. The FLSZ spelling rules tells us that when we hear these sounds made by the letters, 'f', 'l', 's', and 'z' at the end of a word after a short vowel sound, we double these letters to make that sound. We have also learned the rules for doubling a consonant when it is a closed syllable with a suffix are: the suffix must end in a suffix beginning with a vowel, the base word must be one syllable, there is only one vowel in the base word, and the base word ends in one consonant. And finally, just this week we learned the letters, 'ck' are only used at the end of a word or syllable that ends in a short vowel sound.

During our weekly word study program, we take the time to hear all the sounds in each word, represent the sounds (phonemes) we hear using letters (graphemes), discuss the syllables in each word, analyze the meanings of each word, and find rhyming words for each word. It is guite a process, but we finish each week with a final dictation to see how well the students are able to put everything together they have learned to spell each word properly.

Dates to watch for in October include: for those students who are involved in cross country, the extravaganza will be held on Tuesday, October 3; Wednesday, October 4 is the day all walk-a-thon pledge money is due; our walk-a-thon will be held during the afternoon of Thursday, October 5; there will be no school on Friday, October 6 due to a PLC; there will also be no school on Monday, October 9 because of Thanksgiving Day; Picture Day for our class will be held on Wednesday, October 18; and finally, our class will be celebrating Halloween on Tuesday, October 31.

Students should be reading every night at home for minimum of 20 minutes to build reading skills and comprehension. Students have chosen a book for their first book report due Oct. 20th. At this time, students will be sharing their book with their peers with a Starbucks in hand. (Chocolate milk, whip cream, chocolate syrup).

Please make sure your child arrives to school on time in the am as we begin promptly at 9:00 the academics. I still have many parents not signed into Edsby. Please make sure you're able to get signed in, some marks have been posted. I have also started to post a few assignments in Edsby so you can view some of your child's work. I am new to this platform, it's a work in progress.
