GRADE 6

Here are a few reminders and updates for this month: I have changed the format to our morning meeting, as we shift to a focus on social emotional learnings. We are bustling right along with our daily UFLI word study lessons and dictation testing on Fridays. We are continuing to delve further into fiction books. Students have been focusing on identifying the features of narratives (setting, main characters, problem and solution and plot) through class discussions and graphic organizers. We have now wrapped up reading our novel and have moved onto short stories. The unit we are studying currently is called, Growing Up. We continue to focus on predicting, comprehension, making connections to text, and inferencing to help build reading skills. The first Book Report is due December 1st. Some parents were asking for extra work at interview time, so I sent home a current events work packet with your child. Every night, students should be reading for at least twenty minutes. Please encourage your child to continue with this practice. In writing, we continue to focus on descriptive writing and paragraph structure. We are beginning our persuasive writing this month. We are also going to start a reader's theatre in class to help students with their fear of public speaking. This also helps students to build speaking with intonation, volume, fluency, and expression. In Social Studies, students are engaged and working hard on their poster board for their country reports. I have noticed their self-confidence and enthusiasm building. Our cultural fair will be held in the month of January. Since the Christmas season is upon us, as a fun way to celebrate the holiday season, we will be having a Secret Santa exchange on December the 18th. I will send home a note regarding this activity.

Basketball season is underway at WJB!


League games for the Grade 6-7 team starts on January 8. League games for the Grade 4-5 team starts in mid-January.
